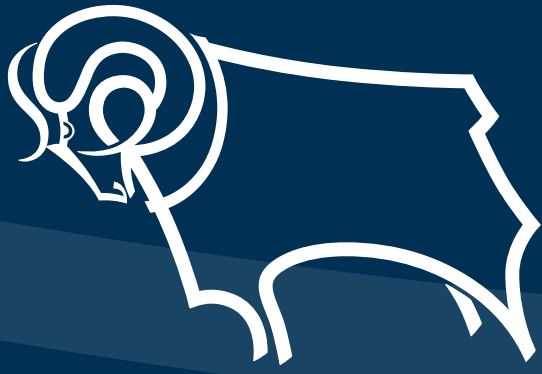

Alongside their studies, students have the opportunity to play football for one of our teams, progress their coaching journey or potentially gain paid employment at the Football Club or Community Trust.

COLLEGE/SIXTH FORM (16-19)

We deliver a range of college courses for students aged 16-19, from A Levels, Level 3 sports courses to Level 2 and Level 1 courses, providing opportunity for all to study at Derby County Community Trust College.

UNIVERSITY (18+)

We provide the opportunity for students to study a university degree course whilst being placed at Derby County, allowing hands on work experience at a working football club alongside studying.

EMPLOYABILITY (16-24)

If you're not currently in employment or training or looking for additional support to take that next step, we run a 12 week employability programme to help you discover your potential.

THE KING'S TRUST TEAM EMPLOYABILITY PROGRAMME

Derby County Community Trust are a delivery partner of The King's Trust, through this we deliver the Team programme across Derbyshire at key intervals throughout the year.

WHAT IS TEAM?

Team is a 12-week youth led personal development programme delivered face to face which aims to increase confidence, motivation, and skills and as a result enables young people to move into employment, education, training, volunteering, or an apprenticeship.

SOME OF THE KEY FEATURES OF THE PROGRAMME

- It is a challenging, structured 12-week programme for Teams of between 12 to 15 young people.
- It begins with team-building activities, including a week at a residential activity centre.
- It continues with teamwork on real projects in the local community and individual work placements.
- It culminates in each Team presenting its achievements to an invited audience and receiving their end of programme certificates.
- Personal development takes place throughout by the process of planning, action, and review.
- Through building their confidence and motivation, young people are encouraged to think about their futures.



LEVEL 1 SPORT QUALIFICATION

VENUE

Classes are based at the Derby Football Hub at the Racecourse.

THE QUALIFICATION

NCFE Level 1 Certificate in Sports: This is a one-year course and upon completion, learners can progress to the Level 2 qualification. Learners studying this course will study all aspects of sports to help prepare them for the level 2 qualification alongside undertaking their maths and English re-sits.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The qualification is entirely coursework based.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Learners looking to study the Level 1 qualification may have GCSE grades ranging from grade 1-2. Learners can re-sit their maths and English alongside studying the Level 1 qualification.

TIMETABLE

The course is full-time, meaning learners may be expected to be in every day depending on their timetable.

FOOTBALL

All learners studying on the Level 1 programme can play for one of our football teams alongside their studies, training three times a week and playing in fixtures on Wednesdays in the EFL CEFA league.



LEVEL 2 SPORT QUALIFICATION

VENUE

Studying with League Football Education (LFE), classes are based at the Derby Football Hub at the Racecourse. The brand-new facility, built at a cost of £11.9m is one of a kind in the area with 4 x full size 3G football pitches on site, along with 3 classrooms and café on site.

THE QUALIFICATION

BTEC Level 2 Diploma in Leading Community Activity: This is a one-year course and upon completion, you can progress to the Level 3 qualification. Learners studying this course will study all aspects of sport coaching to help prepare them for the level 3 qualification alongside undertaking their maths and English re-sits.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The qualification is assignment based, this means that work will be graded Pass, Merit or Distinction depending on the quality of work that you submit.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Learners looking to study the Level 2 will need a minimum of three subjects at grade 3, including at least a grade 2 in English and maths. Learners can re-sit their maths and English alongside studying the Level 2 qualification.

TIMETABLE

The course is full-time, meaning learners may be expected to be in every day depending on their timetable.

FOOTBALL

All learners studying on the Level 2 programme can play for one of our football teams alongside their studies, training three times a week and playing in fixtures on Wednesdays in the EFL CEFA league.



OUR ALUMNI

ISAAC GOODMAN

Isaac studied at the Derby Football Hub at the Racecourse where he achieved a Distinction grade in the BTEC Level 3 in Sport Coaching and Development course.

Isaac is now studying at the University of Derby where he is undertaking a degree in Sports Therapy. He also won Education Champion at the DCCT Annual Awards in 2025 as a recognition of his commitment to his studies.

Studying at Friesland School in Sandiacre will see you based within the Sixth Form. Learners will access high quality teaching provision in a school setting, offering all the support you would expect by being in a Sixth Form.

At Mickleover FC, we have classrooms on site, allowing learners to study at the stadium alongside their football commitments. With a direct pathway to first team football for students to progress down that pathway, should they wish.

Lees Brook offers a central location to study a variety of different courses to suit the learners needs. Students will receive excellent teaching and additional support tailored to their needs allowing them to succeed. With a state of the art 3G pitch on site, it's an ideal venue for students to study alongside their football.

LEVEL 3 SPORT QUALIFICATION AT UNIVERSITY OF DERBY - BUXTON

VENUE

Learners will be based at the University of Derby on a day-to-day basis, experiencing the state-of-the-art facilities that the University has to offer. The University of Derby has excellent teaching spaces along with 2 x full size 3G football pitches, brand new gym facilities, rock climbing wall and a specific sports analysis suite.

THE QUALIFICATION

The qualification that you study at University of Derby - Buxton is the **NCFE Level 3 Extended Diploma in Sport and Physical Activity** which is equivalent to 3 A Levels. Learners will study 18 units in a variety of different subjects giving insight into the sports sector, an example of some of the units include Sports Development, Fitness Testing and Psychology in Sport.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The qualification is assignment based, this means that work will be graded Pass, Merit or Distinction depending on the quality of work that you submit.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum four grade 4 GCSE's, including maths and English.

TIMETABLE

The course is full-time, meaning learners may be expected to be in every day depending on their timetable.

FOOTBALL

All learners studying on the Level 3 programme can play for one of our football teams alongside their studies, training three times a week and playing in fixtures on Wednesdays in the EFL CEFA league.

After leaving Derby County Community Trust, Jevan pursued a football scholarship in the USA where he studies Marketing at Ottawa University.

"I'll always look back on my time at Derby fondly, we had a great set of lads that were good footballer but great mates off the pitch which created a really good environment. We also had a great coach in Gareth who shared his knowledge and experiences with us to make us better players."

Lydia studied at Derby County Community Trust between 2021 – 2023, she studied A-Levels at Friesland School alongside playing football for our women's team.

Upon completing her A-Levels, Lydia went to the USA on a football scholarship, where she studied for an Associate Degree in General Studies at Mineral Area College, in Missouri, while also playing football.

"I spent 2 years at Derby and it was 2 of the best years of my life, we had a great team. We won the league 2 years on the bounce and also won the National Cup. Studying at Derby definitely helped me as I got to combine my studies with playing football to a good level."

VENUE

LEVEL 3 SPORT QUALIFICATION

@ MICKLEOVER FC

VENUE

Learners will be based at the football club on a full-time basis. This includes training and playing at the same facilities the first team use all season.

THE QUALIFICATION

BTEC Level 3 in Sport Coaching and Development: This is a two-year course. Learners will study up to 12 units in a variety of different subjects giving insight into the sports sector, an example of some of the units include Sports Development, Fitness Testing and Psychology in Sport.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The qualification is primarily assignment based, this means that work will be graded Pass, Merit or Distinction depending on the quality of work that you submit.

ETHAN MANN

Following his post 16 studies, Ethan progressed onto our degree programme, this allowed him to continue with his education alongside playing football.

Whilst studying with DCCT, Ethan played for one of our partner clubs, Mickleover FC where he became a first team regular. Ethan's successful spell in Mickleover's first team earned him a move to Stockport County in the summer of 2024 where he signed a professional contract.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum four grade 4 GCSE's, including one of maths and English or a relevant Level 2 qualification.

TIMETABLE

The course is full-time, meaning learners may be expected to be in every day depending on their timetable.

FOOTBALL

All learners studying on the Level 3 programme can play for one of our football teams alongside their studies, training three times a week and playing in fixtures on Wednesdays in the EFL CEFA league.



LEVEL 3 SPORT QUALIFICATION

@ LEES BROOK ACADEMY

VENUE

Studying at Lees Brook School, you will be based within the sixth form at Lees Brook on a day-to-day basis, experiencing the feel of the sixth form environment alongside playing football for Derby County.

THE QUALIFICATION

At Lees Brook, learners have the option of a Level 3 qualification in sport or a Level 1 qualification in construction depending on what type of qualifications each individual wishes to study.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Level 3 Sport - This is a two-year course. Learners will study 18 units in a variety of different subjects giving insight into the sports sector, an example of some of the units include Sports Development, Fitness Testing and Psychology in Sport. Construction Level 1 - primarily practical assessments.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Learners looking to study at Lees Brook on the level 3 sport qualification will need to have a minimum four grade 4 GCSE's, including one of maths and English or a relevant Level 2 qualification. Learners looking to study the level 1 in construction will need a variety of GCSE grades ranging from grade 1-3.

TIMETABLE

The course is full-time, meaning learners may be expected to be in every day depending on their timetable.

FOOTBALL

All learners studying on the Level 2 programme can play for one of our football teams alongside their studies, training three times a week and playing in fixtures on Wednesdays in the EFL CEFA league.

OUR ALUMNI

Ryan studied the at Derby County Community Trust for two years at college level before progressing to complete his degree with us through the University of South Wales. Whilst on the degree, Ryan volunteered weekly at DCCT sessions and was rewarded with a job at the end of his degree course. Ryan now leads on our college programmes as our Senior Education Officer and is a great example of the opportunities on offer at DCCT.



A-LEVELS AT FRIESLAND SCHOOL

Friesland School is our A-Level venue, meaning if you wish to study A-Levels and be part of Derby County Community Trust College, this is the place to study.

VENUE

Learners will be based within the sixth form at Friesland on a day-to-day basis, experiencing the feel of the sixth form environment alongside playing football for Derby County.

THE QUALIFICATION

At Friesland, learners can choose 3 A-Levels from the list of subjects that are on offer. Available subjects can be found by scanning the QR code.



COURSE ASSESSMENT

A-Levels are primarily exam based with some coursework depending on which subjects learners choose to study.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Five GCSEs at grade 5-9, depending on the subjects.

TIMETABLE

The course is full-time, meaning learners may be expected to be in every day depending on their timetable. A typical timetable can be seen below, please note this may be slightly different from year to year.

FOOTBALL

All learners studying A-Levels can play for one of our football teams alongside their studies, training three times a week and playing in fixtures on Wednesdays in the EFL CEFA league.

OUR ALUMNI

CAMILLE JENKINS

Camille progressed through the girls academy at Derby County and at aged 16 studied in the sixth form at Friesland School. Camille studied sociology, psychology and history alongside playing for the DCCT college team before progressing into the Women's Under-21s and first team.

Camille progressed to be a Derby County Women first team regular and has established herself over the past few seasons as a Women's National League footballer. Camille also studies at the University of Derby where she is undertaking a degree in Professional Athlete Development.

DCCT have a partnership with the University of Derby, allowing top female players to continue to play for Derby County alongside their studies.



EVE SHEPHERD

Eve studied the OCR Level 3 Cambridge Technical Diploma in Sport and Physical Activity at Friesland School, completing her studies in the summer of 2023.

Whilst in her second year, Eve progressed to play for Derby County Women's first team, becoming a regular member of the squad in the 2023/24 season.

"I'd never really been involved at an academy before but by joining Derby County Community Trust, they saw some potential in me and helped me to progress my football career. I can't believe how far I've come in such a short space of time but I'm loving every minute of it"



HOW DOES THE FOOTBALL WORK?

All learners across our college programmes (16-19) will be able to play for one of our Derby County Community Trust College teams throughout their time in education with us.

- Train 3 times per week and play competitive fixtures every Wednesday in the EFL CEFA League.
- Our college has 7 male teams and 1 female team, with teams for all abilities.
- Our coaches range from UEFA B to UEFA Pro License and have vast experiences in football that you can learn from.
- Play home games at your study venue and travel to away games on the DCCT minibus.



WHY SHOULD YOU CHOOSE DCCT COLLEGE?

**EFL IN THE
COMMUNITY**

In partnership with the EFL and the University of South Wales, Derby County Community Trust are your local providers of a range of degrees which enable learners to gain their qualifications in a professional sporting environment.

VENUE

Learners will study from Derby County Community Trust, based on Pride Park. Studying within the DCCT environment alongside gaining valuable work experience.

Students will also visit the University of South Wales in Cardiff biannually.

THE QUALIFICATION

We provide a number of opportunities to gain a full degree qualification across three years. Degree courses include:

- **Community Football Coaching and Administration (BSc)**
- **Sports Coaching and Development (BSc)**

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Lectures will be delivered within a sports setting and cover topics including: sports science, physical education and school sport, strategic sports development and football in society.

You will be assessed through practical coaching observations and written assignments.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- **UCAS Points:** 104 (or above)
- **A-Level grades:** BCC (to include one science, mathematics, physical education or psychology but to exclude general studies)
- **BTEC:** BTEC Extended Diploma Distinction Merit Merit in a relevant subject.

University fees apply and student finance is available to all full-time learners. Learners should apply directly through UCAS, but our Education team are on hand to support the process and welcome potential students to get in touch before applying.

WORK PLACEMENT

You'll gain a wide range of experiences within Derby County Football Club's community setting while working towards your FA Level 2 Coaching qualification, with further opportunities to develop through part-time volunteering or paid roles within the Trust and the wider football and sports environment.



OUR ALUMNI

SHANNON PURDY

Shannon studied a degree in Community Football Coaching and Administration whilst with us. She graduated in 2023 with a first-class honours degree and now works full time at DCCT as a community coach. Shannon works out in local schools, delivering PE lessons and after school clubs.
